74.7 PER CENT COLLECTED IN CHEST DRIVE

\$348,617.69 Is In Hand As Canvassers Redouble Their Efforts

FINAL 'PUSH' HARDEST Workers Going Back Over Territory To Obtain More Subscriptions

With \$348,617.69, or 74.7 per cent of the quota, already collected and received, the battalion of Community Chest campaigners were engaged in intensive "mopping up" operations today in an effort to get out of the "trenches" and "over the top" before Friday night.

Although only \$118,138.75 stands between them and the goal for the year—\$466,756.44—Chest officials say the toughest part of the campaign still lies ahead.
