BRITAIN JOINS HULL'S TRADE PACT CIRCLE

Steel and Iron Products Among Items On Which America Gains

U. S. COAL GROUP KICKS

This Country Also Grants Concessions On Textiles, Whisky, Metal Goods

LONDON, Nov. 18.—Great Britain and the United States joined today in a world trade pact on the basis of international commercial concessions among 20 nations. The United States now is expected to extend trade reciprocity farther into the Americas.

Great Britain joined the world reciprocal circle yesterday by signing a trade agreement with the United States. Britain simultaneously signed a revision of a three-year-old reciprocal trade treaty with this country.

American wheat, corn and fruit growers appear to have secured the outstanding gains from the British treaty. The United States was favored by concessions on lead, iron and other pig products. Great Britain abandoned its tariff protection on wheat. But the area and extent of benefits is likely to be disputed.

Textile Concessions

Great Britain appears to have gained most in concessions on wool, whisky, textiles and manufactured metal goods.

A State Department analysis asserted that the Canadian and British agreements, which are mutually beneficial to American and British interests, but that protection is inevitable and may be widespread.

Germany Joins

Germany stands now as the major nation entirely outside the circle of those nations which are in the pact.

Mr. Dixon plans to return to Birmingham immediately after the conference in order to be in contact with his family on Thanksgiving Day.

Grid Star Slew Neighbor To Save Father, He Tells Jury In Feud Murder Trial

Gun Battle Near Irondale Described To 12 Men Who Must Decide Fate Of Hewitt High School Quarterback; Five Guns Were Used In Fight

A jury in Circuit Court must decide whether a 16-year-old high school football star is guilty of murder or had the right to "protect" his father when another man fired on him.

The defendant is James O. Bonner Jr., Hewitt High School junior and quarterback, whose tragic encounter with the law has kept him from playing with his team this season.

Two years elapsed with killing J. D. Moore, 54-year-old neighbor in a gun battle at Alton community near Irondale on June 27 as a culmination of a feud between the Bonner and Moore families.

Says Woman Had Gun

Bonner declared that Moore obtained a shotgun and shot the elderly Bonner and later attempted to shoot the defendant's father with a .22-caliber rifle.

He Told Jury That Moore Came Out of His House to the Road and Carried Him

Witnesses said the shooting at a pistol away from the older man when Moore fired at him.

A Five-Gun Fight

Witnesses said the fight had erupted between the two families for a long time.

Assault Of Starting Row

The state's attorney contended that young Moore shot Moore's house and provoked the difficulty.

Jury Acquits Physician In Winfield's Bizarre Murder Mystery

HAMILTON, Nov. 18.—The most sensational "Whisper" occurrence in the history of Marion County—the murder of the invalid doctor's wife—was a closed chapter today.

Dr. Rowley H. Barnes was acquitted of the murder of his wife by a jury yesterday afternoon and the "same" doctor was freed from a three-year term of confinement.
