

This multimedia, interactive workshop has been designed for educators who seek to deepen their exploration of current scholarship in the field of Holocaust education. Participants will deeply explore some of the major themes of the 4th Edition of the Facing History and Ourselves' *Holocaust and Human Behavior* Resource Book, which includes identity, the role of antisemitism, the impact of World War I, and ideologies that contributed to the Holocaust. Participants will then consider the role of justice, legacies of this history, and their own individual agency to create a more humane world. Facing History staff will model implementation of Facing History's pedagogical approach in order to support teachers and engage students as they learn critical thinking skills necessary to examine, analyze, interpret, and compare primary source documents related to the course curriculum.
