Hundreds Honor Betty Allenberg Goldstein at *L'Chaim* 2016

Hundreds of friends of Betty Allenberg Goldstein and the BHEC joined together in August to honor Betty and to celebrate Holocaust education in Alabama.

The program included performances by Ray Reach and his band, regaling the crowd with tunes by Betty's favorite, Frank Sinatra. The drama class from Benjamin Russell High School performed their award-winning production of *I Never Saw Another Butterfly*, and Temple Emanu-El Cantor Jessica Roskin sang.

The event raised over \$300,000 for the Holocaust Center and our outreach programs. The funds from *L'Chaim* ensure the BHEC can continue providing resources for classrooms throughout the state of Alabama.

L'Chaim Co-Chair Joel Rotenstreich describes Betty as "a giver, doer, goer, helper, and more. She is all heart, and the first one

there." Betty's behind-the-scenes work through the years has helped the BHEC grow and develop valuable new partnerships.

The event was hosted at the Sirote Theater in UAB's Alys Stephens Center's, a fitting tribute to honor Betty in the theatre named for her long-time friend and companion Morris Sirote.

As always, a wonderful cadre of bakers from throughout the community prepared delicious treats for attendees to enjoy at the dessert reception following the performances.

The program was developed and produced by BHEC Vice President Deborah Layman. Carole Pizitz and Joel Rotenstreich co-chaired the fundraising efforts. Nik Layman photographed the event. 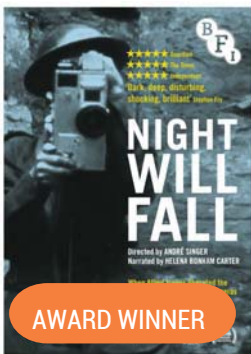
